

If you have ever lived in an area that had amazing parks with playgrounds set, then you certainly miss it. You could go to the swing and slide set whenever and wherever you wanted, on any day of the week. We did not want to take you down memory lane; instead, we wanted you to know that if you have space and kids at home, you can certainly consider buying a swing sets for your backyard or lawn.

Getting a swing set may seem very easy unless you start finding a playground set for yourself. There are several choices and quality gradations, so getting the best swing and slide set is very complicated. After thorough research, we have gathered a few things you should consider before buying a swing set. Take a look at these to make a better decision.

- **Long term planning**

Please do not go for the swing set that is perfect as in a year or so; they will be older and outgrow it. You will need more vigilance for supervising the children on a bigger swing sets initially, but it will be worth it in the longer run. You can purchase a modular playground set and then keep on adding pieces with it.

- **Space**

You will need a minimum of 6 feet clearance around the swing set for the child's safety. Think about it before choosing the size of your swing set. You should think about the orientation, like if you can see the swing and slide set from the window in your kitchen.



- **Material and Construction**

There is a range of construction and material being used for the swing set. A wooden set will look good in the landscape, but it will need staining every look to look presentable. The swing and slide set made of softer wood are dented easily. It is crucial to look at the quality and strength of hardware. Redwood and cedarwood are perfect for the swing set as both these materials will resist weather damage and bugs without any chemical treatment. A few swing sets are started chemically for the improvement of weather and pest resistance. This means that your child will be exposed to chemicals whenever he comes in contact with such a [playground set](#).

Metal swing sets are durable and reliable. There can be variations in the protective coating of metal. Mid-sized and small-sized swing sets are usually made of alloy or steel with a protective coating. Power coats and galvanized steel provide the best rust and weather resistance. The playground set made from recyclable materials will need lesser maintenance and will not give your child splinters. However, it is more expensive.

Before buying, see if the plastic that is used is recommended for outdoor and indoor use. Also, regardless of the quality of plastic, it will still fade when put in the sun. Although, it

does not come with any risk of rust and slivers as well as a lesser chance of dangerous heat. Still, you should look at the temperature of the plastic swing and slide set to ensure that they are not hot.

- **Installation**

The installation and delivery of the swing set may cost a lot, at times more than the playground set. A few installers will charge per hour, and a few will charge by the number of steps given in instructions. You should know that it may take almost 40 hours to install a swing set. If you are planning to do it on your own, know what it may take. It is a lot more time-consuming and challenging than you may expect. If you think that you will not be able to manage it on your own, then go for a [swing and slide set](#) that consists of installation at the cost.

- **Timing**

The playground set is cyclical. For installation summers, you have to pay a lot in early spring. You will get discounts at the season's end because the dealers are unloading the inventory. You might also get deals on older models when the new ones come out.



- **Age Range**

The manufacturers recommend an age range on the basis of the material of the swing set, its design, and size. It is essential to purchase the swing and slide set that is appropriate for your kid's age. If a swing set is made for a seven-year-old, then it will be dangerous for your toddler. A swing set for toddlers and babies comes with the swing of a 5 point or 3 point harness to hold the child securely as he swings. The ladder and slides are also more minor and might be textured in order to reduce your child's risk of falling as well as lesser chances of injury when they fall.



- **Safety**

Safety should always be the priority when considering a playground set as your [Kids](#) will be using it. The playground set must be appropriate for the age, but it is also essential to consider the following things:

- Swings - Swings that are made of rubber and plastic are safer as compared to wood or metal as they are easier to sit on, more stable, and will not be hot. The Swings must be 8 inches apart, at least so there is no mid-swing collision.

- Slides - The lighter colored slides of the playground set will be cooler as compared to metal slides. Still, check the temperature before your child plays on the playground set.
- Protective Surfaces - The shock-absorbing surfaces of the playground set that protect your kids if they fall. The protective surface must cover twice the swing set's height on both sides of the frame.
- Anchors - The unanchored swing set might blow in harsh weather conditions.
